



2014 Hollymont Counselor-in-Training Program

Making the transition from camper to CIT to staff member is a challenging yet rewarding process. The CIT program at Hollymont is designed to guide you through this process by teaching leadership skills, encouraging effective time management, developing strong work habits and strengthening your faith in God. All of this is done while having fun! As a CIT you will work alongside of staff members to create opportunities for growth in the life of our campers through skills, night activities, and nightly devotions. Specifically, CIT's will help teach and assist 3 skills during the day, plan a vesper service for all of camp, serve meals during lunch and dinner, participate in an off campus service project, help lead devotions within the cluster and perform various work projects on campus.

For first time applicants, there are three 13 day session choices to choose from:

Job Description for Counselor-in-Training Camp Hollymont for Girls

Qualifications:

- Since counselors-in-training must be on the halls with the campers, supervise their activities, and meet or assist with individual camper personal needs, counselors-in-training must be **female**.
- Counselors in training must be a rising junior or senior in high school and we prefer applicant's who are 16 years of age by their camp session.** We reserve the right to hold applications and make selections that best fit the needs of the camp community.
- We consider a CIT applicant's personal relationship with Jesus Christ, her personality, her willingness to serve, her potential for the long-term, and when applicable, her previous performance at Hollymont.

Responsibilities/Expectations:

1. Opening and closing day preparations (early morning prior to check-in/check-out)
2. Actively assist counselor with your assigned cluster.
 - a) Get campers up in the morning and to bed at night.
 - b) Help the girls clean their rooms and keep track of their personal items.
 - c) Help get the girls to skills on time.
 - b) Monitor rest hour and after lights out.
 - c) Actively participate in cluster devotions as guided by the cluster counselor.
3. Meet daily schedule.
 - a) Breakfast and serving meals
 - b) CIT meeting, planning, training, devotion workshops
 - c) Work periods including mailroom, canteen, and/or camp store.
 - d) Assist with skills, program activity preparations, and other duties as assigned.
4. Plan and conduct Sunday evening Vespers.
5. Be early or on time to ALL skills, meals, CIT meetings, hall & cluster activities, night activities, and all other camp activities.
6. Assist with am/pm activities, pic-a-skill, hall activities, and night activities.
7. Serve as a Camp Hollymont representative to arriving campers and visiting prospective campers and their parents.
8. Assist camp staff with between session campers.
9. CITs are expected to model for campers a Christ-like attitude as well as set a Godly example in all they do. CITs are to model for campers the policies, procedures, and rules established by Hollymont. These include, but are not limited to, use of electronics and cell phones, lights out, and off-campus visitors.

Directly Responsible To:

The CIT Leader(s) will provide leadership and oversight for the CIT team. Additionally, each CIT will be a part of the hall leadership team and will be responsible to her counselor(s) and head counselor.

Camp Hollymont for Girls

Statement of Faith

During the campers' stay at Hollymont, our desire is to see them grow in their knowledge and love of the Lord. This growth is accomplished by nurturing their relationship with Jesus Christ and by teaching them to have a Biblical World and Life View. In establishing and directing Camp Hollymont, all camp staff are expected to hold to these central beliefs:

1. The Sovereignty of God - The sovereignty of God insists that God is Lord and that He reigns in history and over the entire universe. God creates, sustains, governs and directs everything.
2. Scripture Alone – The Bible is God's word to man. It is man's only infallible and inerrant rule for faith and life.
3. Grace Alone – God's work in man is all of grace. Man has done nothing to deserve or earn salvation. (Ephesians 2:8-9)
4. Christ Alone – Jesus Christ is the sole one who saves. There is no salvation in anyone or anything else. He is the only one sent by God for this purpose.
5. For the Glory of God alone – The primary reason for living is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever.

We recognize that Hollymont staff will come from various church backgrounds and denominations. However, staff members representing Camp Hollymont, will be expected to lead devotions in light of these faith statements, and to answer camp questions in light of the same. In addition to the above statement of faith, staff must also agree to the following lifestyle statements:

Concerning salvation:

Recognizing that we have all sinned and come short of the glory of God, I believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and Savior of sinners and I receive and rest upon Him alone for salvation. I promise, in reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit, that I will seek to live as becomes the followers of Christ.

Concerning my relationship with others:

I will respect the beliefs of other staff and campers and will promote only that which is consistent with these statements and Scripture.

I declare that as a follower of Christ, I am not engaging in and will not engage in inappropriate sexual conduct, including but not limited to: heterosexual activity outside of marriage, homosexual or lesbian activity, sexual harassment, pornographic activity or sexual abuse toward minors as defined by Scripture and federal or state law.

Concerning my relationship with those in authority:

I will seek to have a teachable spirit, a love for others and a willingness to confront my co-workers in a biblical manner when conflict arises. I will respectfully submit to the camp leadership and seek to create an environment of mutual respect and compatibility.

I agree to the Statement of Faith and lifestyle statements listed above. My signature indicates I agree to live by these statements while employed by Camp Hollymont and failure to do so can lead to my dismissal.
